# BA (Hons) Historical Studies (Full-Time) - SH358

### 1. Objectives

This degree programme is designed to provide knowledge and competence in the field of historical studies. It equips students with the skills required for a number of history-related professions such as teaching, research, journalism, archive, museum heritage-related professions. It also provides the necessary skills and historical background for further studies as well as providing a sound knowledge base for other professions such as diplomacy, law, media, international institutions, journalism, social work and non-governmental organization (NGOs). The programme includes the teaching of transferable skills and is varied enough to allow students to apply their acquired skills in many other fields in their future life. Students will be given the opportunity in the final year to submit a portfolio based on research and practical work.

A credit in English Language at Cambridge School Certificate/'O' Level or equivalent. 2 GCE 'A' Level passes in 2 subjects.

#### 7. Assessment

Each module will be assessed over 100 marks with details as follows (unless otherwise specified).

Written examinations for modules will be carried out at the end of the academic year except for semester modules (unless otherwise stated) and count for 70% of the total mark for the module, except for a module where the structure makes for other specific provision (s).

Assessment will be carried out on performance in three areas: Programme work, practical work, tutorials, and written examinations.

Students on internships will submit portfolios, which includes practical exercises, assignments and reports.

Continuous Assessment will be based on a compulsory written class test and assignments/or oral presentations. The continuous assessment will count for 30% of the overall percentage mark of the module(s), except for a module where the structure makes for other specific provision (s).

An overall total of 40% for combined continuous assessment and written examination components would be required to pass the module, without minimum thresholds within the individual continuous assessment and written examination. The same criterion will apply for modules being assessed jointly. Note that all overall mark for the two modules will be considered and not the individual marks for each of the two modules.

### 8. Submission Deadline for Portfolio/Research Project

Research Portfolio should be around 6,000 – 8000 words (excl. footnotes and bibliography).

Three copies of the Portfolio (two spiral-bound copies and one soft copy in a single PDF text file on electronic storage media) should be submitted to the Faculty/Centre Registry and in addition, a soft copy in a single PDF text file should be uploaded on the "'Turnitin' Platform", in the final assignment submission link indicated by the Programme/Project Coordinator.

All of the above should be submitted not later than the last week day of March in the final year by 4.00 p.m. at latest, unless specified otherwise in the Programme of Studies.
