UNIVERSITY OF MAURITIUS SHORT COURSE: DESCRIPTION

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

Title: Introducing Academic Writing in English

Duration: 15 contact hours

On offer: As from June 2024 (over 5 days)

2. TARGET AUDIENCE

This short course is aimed mainly, but not exclusively, at:

- (1) Prospective students, that is, students who are preparing to join university, locally and abroad.
- (2) Students who are already enrolled at university (locally and abroad) and require additional help with essay writing skills at this level.

3. PRE-REQUISITE(S)/PRE-REQUIREMENT(S)

Applicants should satisfy the following entry requirements, which are the General Entry Requirements for Undergraduate Certificates:

- (a) A School Certificate with credit in two appropriate subjects or equivalent
- OR (b) Qualifications awarded by other universities and institutions, which have been approved by the Senate as satisfying the minimum requirements for admission.
- OR (c) The IGCSE.

Participants will be required to submit a portfolio of assessment and will be awarded a 'Certificate of Successful Completion'.

The price of the short course is Rs 2 500.

There will be no more than 15 participants per group so that participants get individual attention during the workshops.

4. AIMS

The aims of this short course are as follows:

- Read, analytically and critically, a selection of texts on a specific topic
- Address a set question for an argumentative essay with understanding
- Identify ideas relevant to a set question for an argumentative essay
- Plan and draft a coherent argumentative essay
- Plan and draft coherent paragraphs
- Edit and proofread the final text

5. OUTLINE SYLLABUS

Through Contact Hours:

- Understanding key features of an argumentative text
- Using knowledge about argumentative texts to draft an academic essay
- Developing awareness of the importance of accurate language use in an academic essay

Through Self-Learning:

- Close, analytical and critical reading/understanding of selected assigned texts
- Viewing and reviewing online supporting materials
- Preparing for tasks to be carried out in face-to-face workshops
- Practising argumentative essay writing through assigned exercises and tasks
